JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to succession to the Presidency and Vice Presidency and

to cases where the President is unable to discharge the powers and duties of his office.

1. Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United
2. States of America in Congress assembled, (two-thirds of each House con-
3. curring therein), That the following article is proposed as an amendment
4. to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
5. intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by the
6. legislatures of three-fourths of the several States within seven years
7. from the date of its submission by the Congress:

"Article 1"

8. SECTION 1. In case of the removal of the President from office or
9. of his death or resignation, the Vice President shall become President.
10. SECTION 2. When ever there is a vacancy in the office of the Vice
11. President, the President shall nominate a Vice President who shall take
12. office upon confirmation by a majority vote of both Houses of Congress.
13. SECTION 3. If the President declares in writing that he is unable to
14. discharge the powers and duties of his office, such powers and duties
15. shall be discharged by the Vice President as Acting President.
16. SECTION 4. If the President does not so declare, and the Vice
17. President with the written concurrence of a majority of the heads of
18. the executive departments or such other body as Congress may by law provide,
19. transmits to the Congress his written declaration that the President is
20. unable to discharge the powers and duties of his office, the Vice President
21. shall immediately assume the powers and duties of the office as Acting
22. President.

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1. SECTION 5. Whenever the President transmits to the Congress
2. his written declaration that no inability exists, he shall resume
3. the powers and duties of his office unless the Vice President,
4. with the written concurrence of a majority of the heads of the
5. executive departments or such other body as Congress may by law
6. provide, transmits within two days to the Congress his written de-
7. claration that the President is unable to discharge the powers and
8. duties of his office. Thereupon Congress will immediately decide
9. the issue. If the Congress determines by two-thirds vote of both
10. Houses that the President is unable to discharge the powers and
11. duties of the office, the Vice President shall continue to discharge
12. the same as Acting President; otherwise the President shall resume
13. the powers and duties of his office.
