







Relationship to Commercial Agricultural Exports MILLIE








MILLIONS OF BUSHELS



Government Financed Shipments—by Program




The Relationship to Other Exporting Countries 1,000 METRIC TONS



Shipments -by Commodity






DAIRY PRODUCTS: Butter-Cheese-Non-fat dry milk



Government Financed Shipments by Region MILLIONS OF DOLLARS





Commercial Exports during impact years of market development program




