

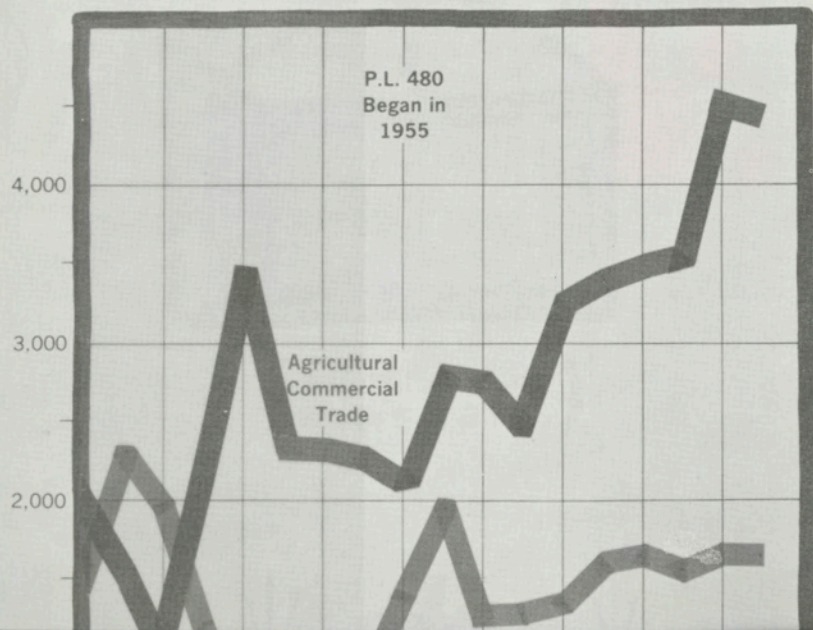

## Relationship to Commercial Agricultural Exports

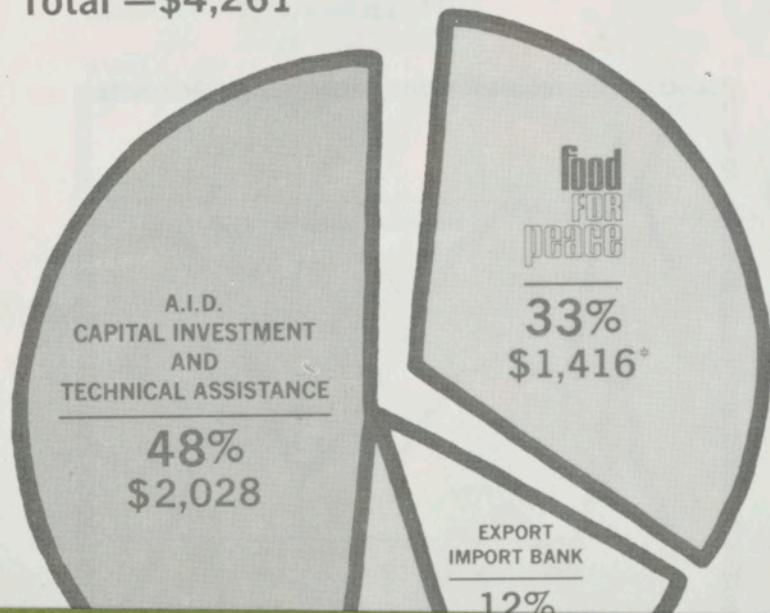
MILLIONS OF DOLLARS



## U.S. Government Economic Assistance Effort

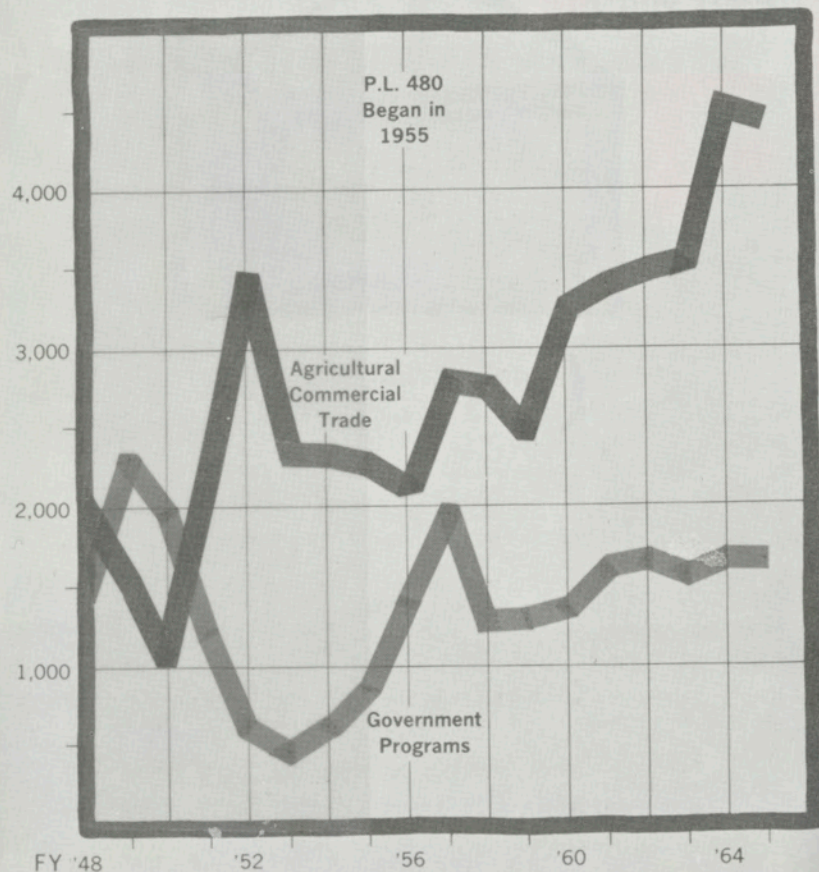
FISCAL YEAR 1965

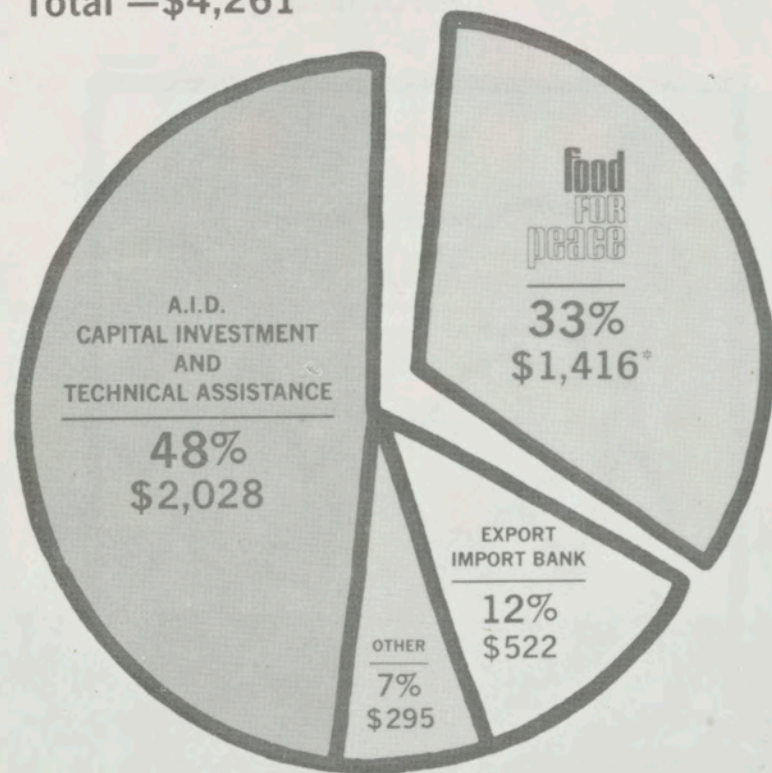

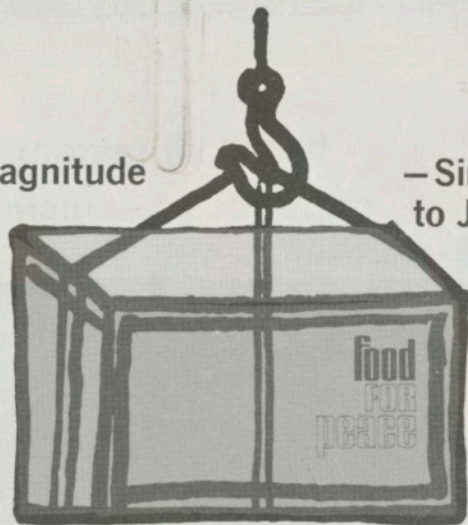

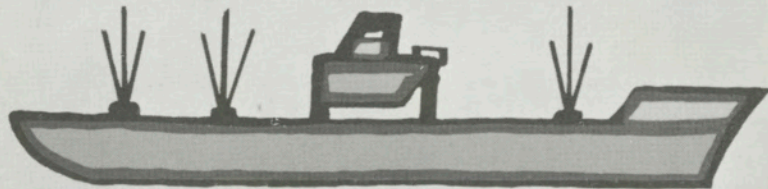

to July 1965



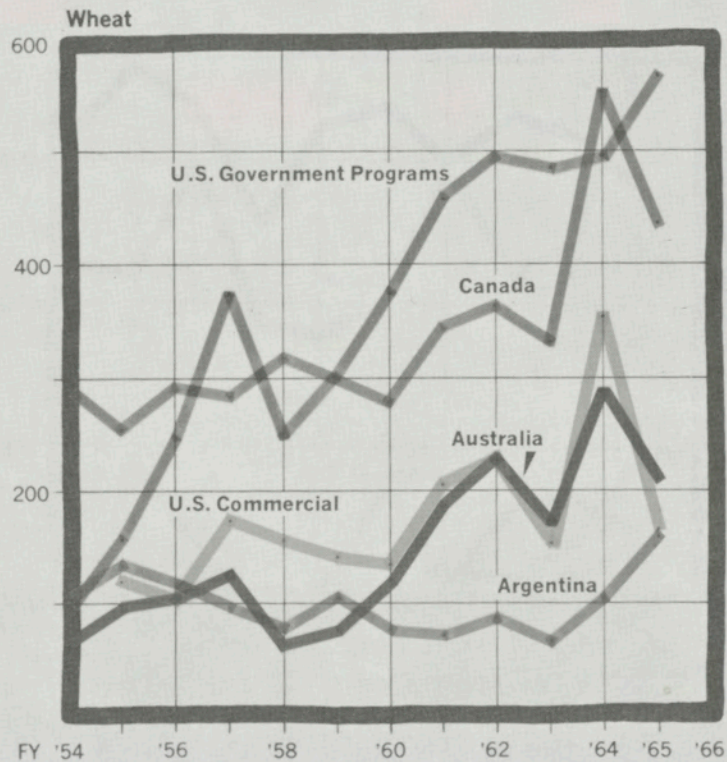

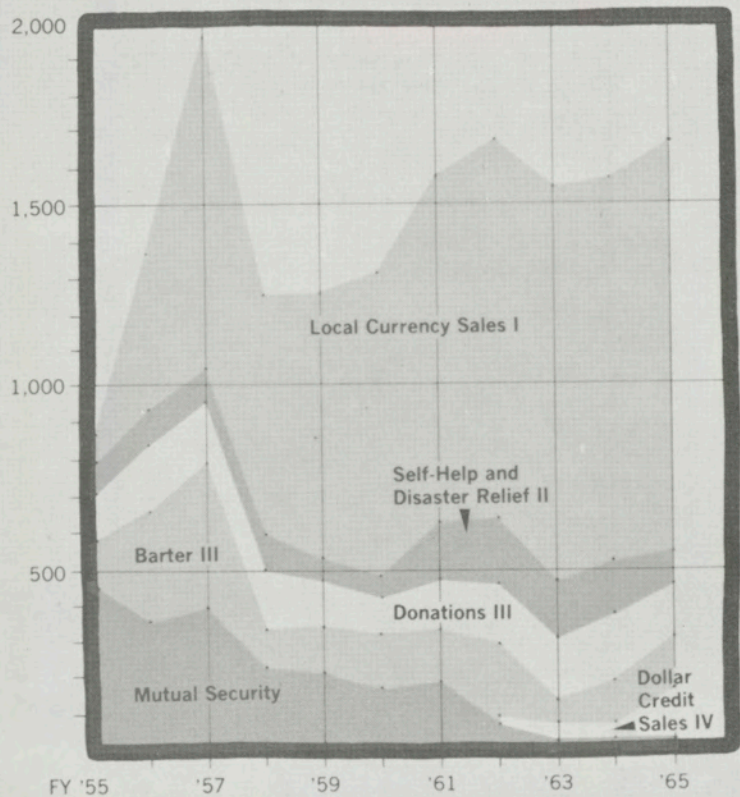

## Government Financed Shipments—by Program

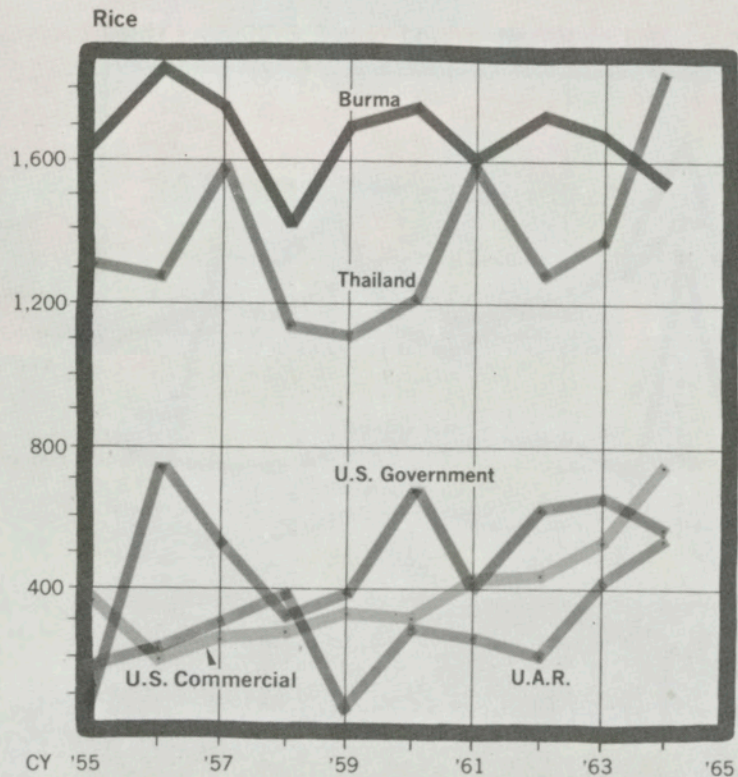

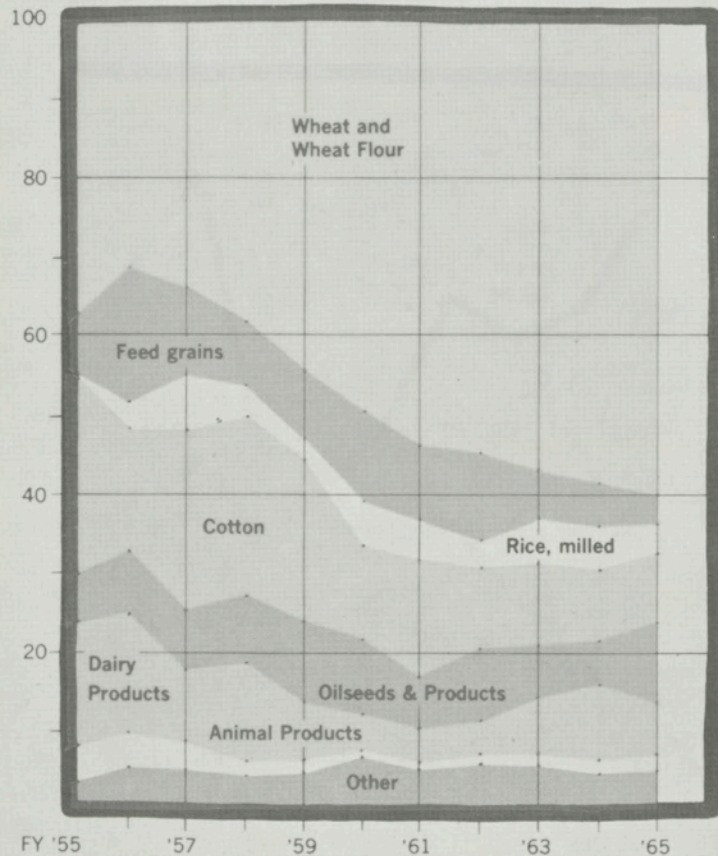

PERCENT OF TOTAL

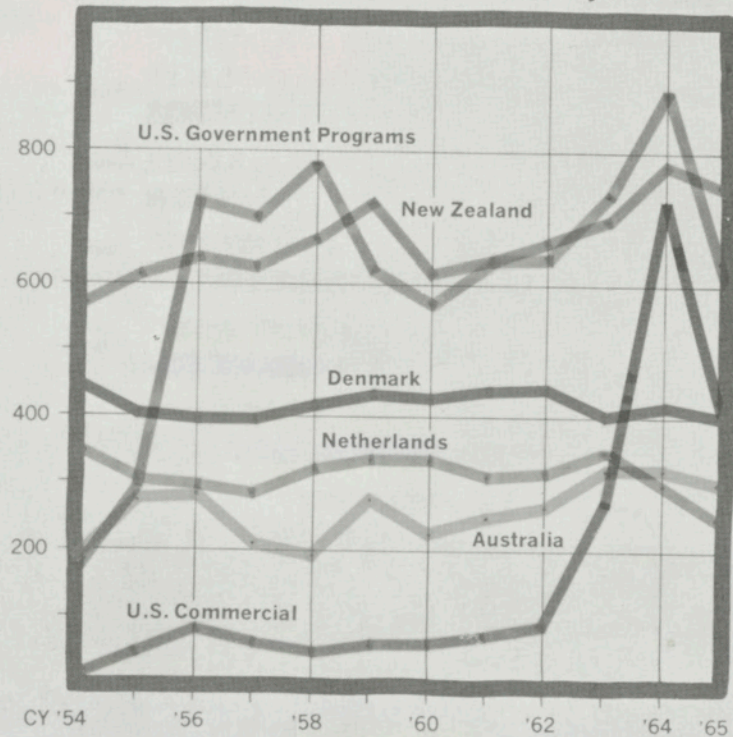

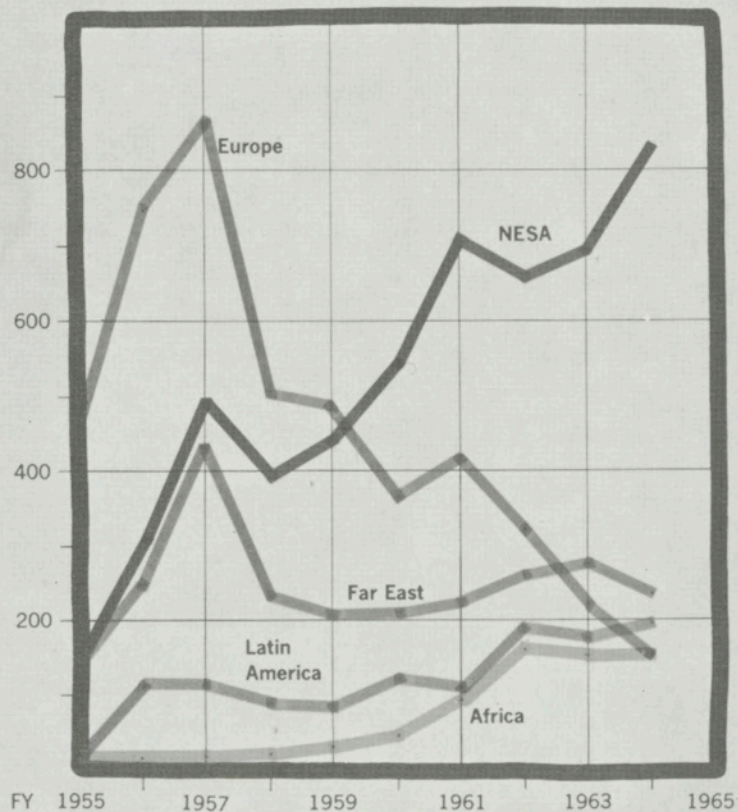

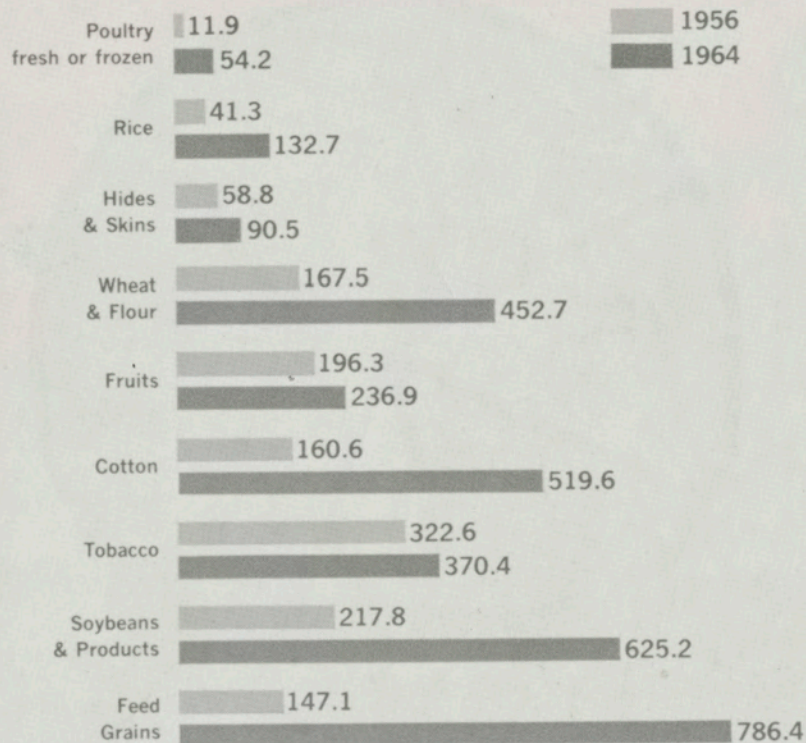
## Government Financed Shipments by Region

MILLIONS OF DOLLARS



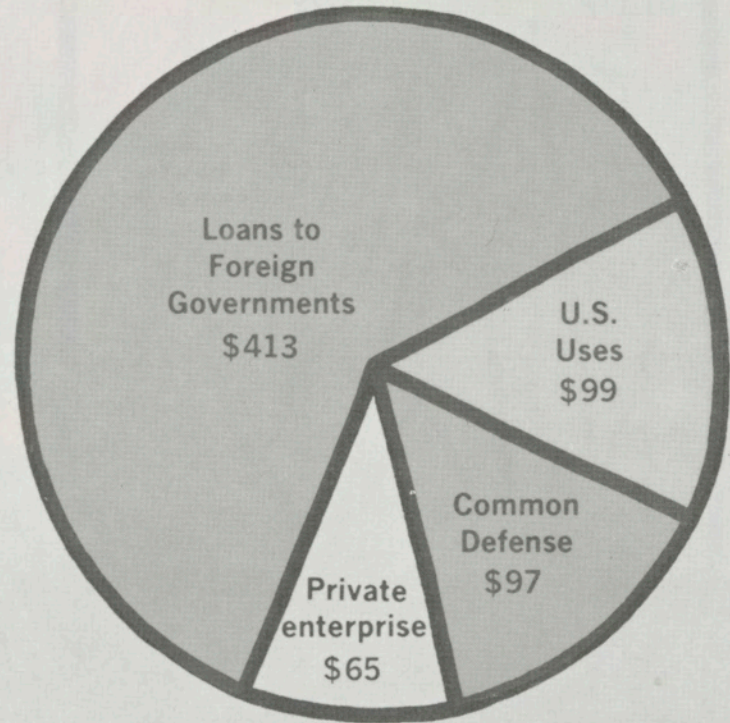
## Commercial Exports during impact years of market development program

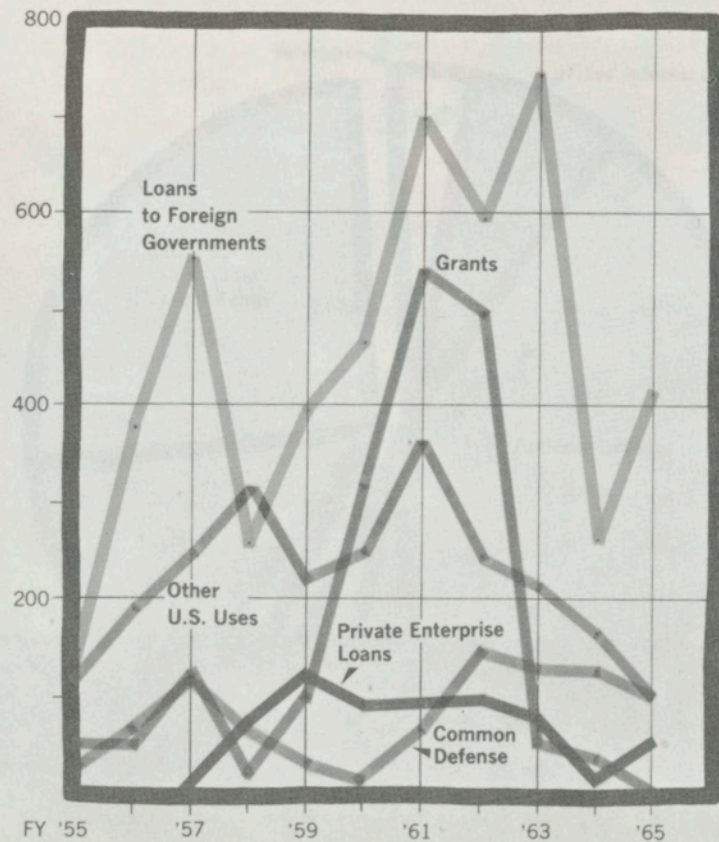

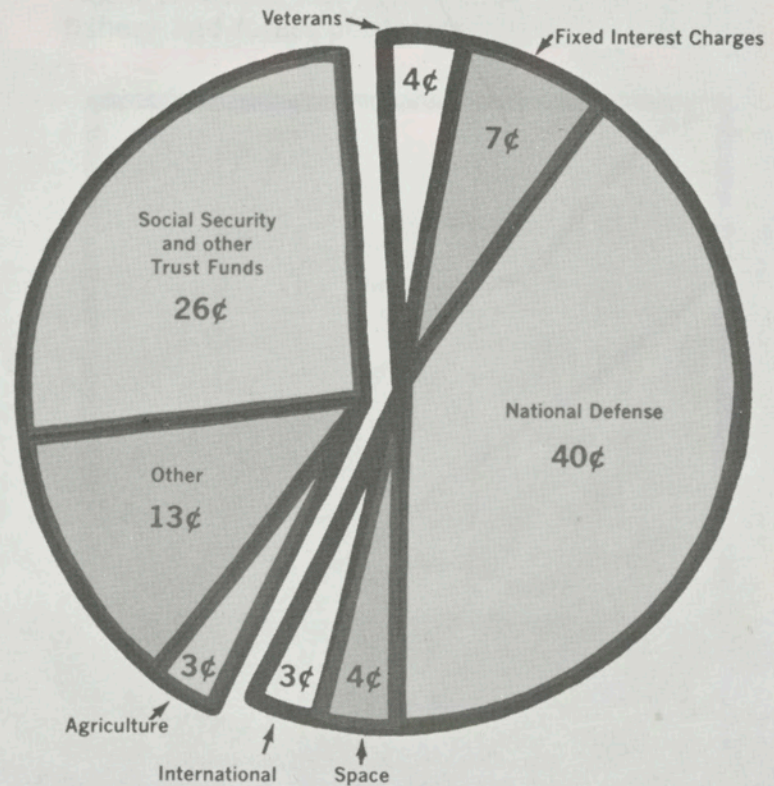

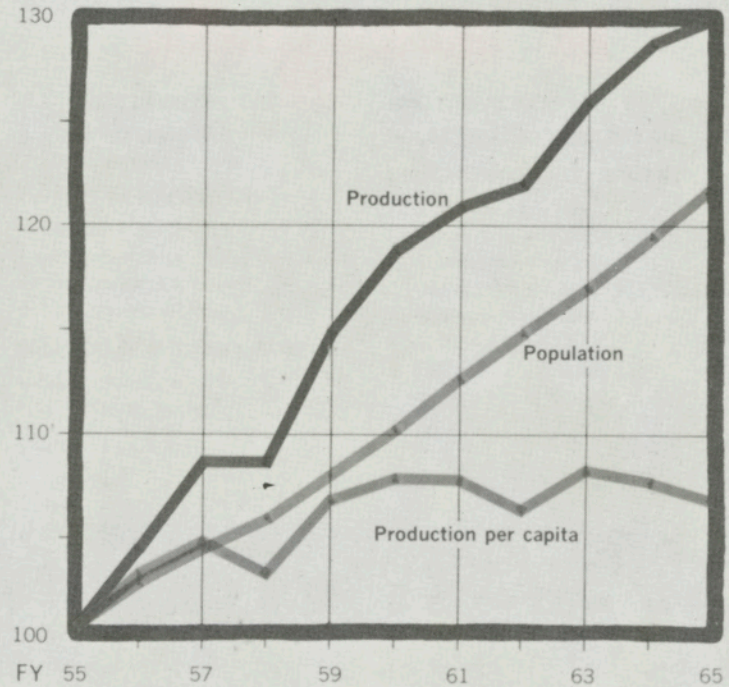
