Dear Sir:

It appears that the Federal Government is preempting all functions of the State Governments. At the rate that the Federal Government is moving in on all problems, we will have no need for State Governments. This is completely contrary to the "Founding Fathers" and to the "Check and Balance System" that was designed to protect the rights of the people.

It is already quite obvious, just a few months after the Education Bill was passed, that the Federal Government will be controlling the entire public school system within a matter of years or maybe a matter of months. The greatest threat that the American people have is from a Dictatorial Government, and steadily the Bureaucrats are assuming more and more power. In dealing with the Federal Government, they are always right and the citizens are invariably wrong. Quite often you have no recourse except through costly and extensive legislation.

I am opposed to this Bill because it will place the Federal Government in the Workmen's Compensation Field and preempt all the laws of the various states that are now doing an adequate job in this field.
