I have your letter of November 27th, requesting my opinion concerning the medical insurance provision in the Social Security Amendments of 1965, which has recently become the law of the land. I appreciate hearing from you and am pleased that you want my advice in this matter.

The provision in the law requires that you pay a large portion of the cost of this medical insurance and that the government will share this cost. The American Medical Association, many of the labor unions, many benevolent groups and other groups who are interested have approved this plan. I feel that it will be beneficial and would recommend that you take this insurance when the time comes to do so. It may be that you can do so now - I do not recall the exact time for signing up, but you will not be required to pay the monthly premium until July, 1966.
